The Greenwood Genetic Center has made significant operational changes, but remains open to serve our patients and families during this challenging time. Employees who can work from home are doing so, and those who must be in the office are working on staggered shifts and are practicing social distancing.

Patient appointments are being handled virtually through telegenetics visits from the provider's home offices to the patient's home. While GGC has been offering telegenetics on a smaller scale since 2016, this has been a new endeavor for many of our clinicians. Our **Diagnostic Laboratories** remain open, and turnaround times have not been impacted. Samples are being collected through saliva swab kits sent directly to patient homes.
