I. <u>SC COVID-19 STATE REPORT</u>:

The purpose of this report is to develop a shared understanding of the current status of the pandemic at the national, regional, state and local levels. Data at the state level may differ from that available at the federal level. The objective of this report is to use consistent data sources and methods that allow for comparisons to be made across localities. South Carolina data reveals a slight increase in COVID-19 cases state-wide in the past week. II. SC CARES PANDEMIC RELIEF GRANTS PROGRAM:

The South Carolina Department of Administration announced a \$40 million grant program for small businesses for revenue loss due to COVID-19. Grants will range from \$2,500 to \$25,000 and can be used to reimburse expenditures for staffing, operating, facility and PPE costs as well as revenue loss. III. CVS & WALGREENS WILL ADMINISTER VACCINES TO RESIDENTS OF LTCF:

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services and Department of Defense have announced a partnership with CVS and Walgreens in conjunction with Operation Warp Speed to distribute the COVID-19 vaccines to Long Term Care Facilities at no out of pocket expense. Read the release <u>here</u>.

IV. SOUTH CAROLINA COVID-19 VACCINE PLAN:

On October 16, 2020 the SC Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC) submitted to the U.S. Health and Human Services (HHS) the state's COVID-19 Vaccination Plan. The goal of the plan is to detail the equitable distribution of the vaccine across the state, based on the most current federal guidance and recommendations. Currently, there is limited information about the COVID-19 vaccine. South Carolina, like other states, is awaiting a time frame and further reports from the federal government about progress with vaccine development. To view the state's draft plan <u>click here</u>.

V. <u>COVID-19 AUDIT & COST REPORT FILING GUIDANCE</u>:

On October 19, 2020, DDSN sent out the following information to Executive Directors and Financial Directors regarding COVID-19 audit and cost reporting. The purpose is to provide guidance to agencies in our network receiving DDSN grant funds and also obtained or anticipate obtaining COVID-19 related stimulus funding (e.g., Payroll Protection Program (PPP); Cares Act Provider Relief Fund (PRF); and Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA)). This guidance is needed to ensure agencies in our network using stimulus funding for payroll or other costs do not inadvertently encroach on proper Medicaid cost reporting to DDSN in annual reports.
