News Release of Meeting

Chairperson Danielson called the meeting to order and Commissioner Ravenel read a statement of announcement about the meeting that was mailed to the appropriate media, interested persons, and posted at the Central Office and on the website in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act.

Invocation

Commissioner Thompson gave the invocation.

Adoption of the Agenda

The Commission adopted the June 16, 2015 Meeting Agenda by unanimous consent. (Attachment A)

Approval of the Minutes of the May 21, 2015 Commission Meetings

The Commission approved the May 21, 2015 Commission Meeting minutes by unanimous consent.

Public Input

Mr. Ralph Courtney, Executive Director, Tri-Development Center of Aiken County Inc./Aiken County Board of Disabilities spoke on behalf of the SCDSPC.

Commissioners' Update

Commissioners Thompson, Lemel, and Ravenel spoke of events in their district.

Nominating Committee

Commissioner Davis, Chairman of the Nominating Committee, presented the following slate of officers for FY 2015-2016 – Commissioner Danielson as Chairperson, Commissioner Lynn as Vice Chairman, and Commissioner Ravenel as Secretary.

Election of Officers

The slate of officers from the nominating committee was presented and Chairperson Danielson asked for any nominations from the floor. Commissioner Lemel nominated Commissioner Ravenel as Chairperson. The nomination was seconded. A vote was taken by written ballot with the result being a tie for Chairperson between Commissioner

Danielson and Commissioner Ravenel. Another vote was to be taken but Commissioner Ravenel removed herself from the slate. A second vote was taken by written ballot, resulting in the election of Bill Danielson as chairperson for FY 2015-2016. By acclamation, the following slate of officers FY 2015-2016 were approved- Commissioner Lynn as Vice Chairman, and Commissioner Ravenel as Secretary.

Waiting List Progress Report

Mrs. Susan Beck gave a detailed update of the Intellectual Disability/Related Disabilities, the Community Supports and the Head and Spinal Cord reduction waiting list reduction efforts, as well as the Critical Needs List. Commissioner Lynn would like to see a trend and suggested a graph be created showing how new funding is affecting the waiting list. Discussion followed as to how the movement of the waiting lists can be increased. (Attachment B)

Budget Update

Mr. Tom Waring reported that the 2016 budget process is continuing. The Legislature is back today meeting. The House is working on the Supplemental Bill for 2016 and the Senate is working on the Continuing Resolution Bill for 2016. The department is hoping the Senate Version for the agency budget passes which has \$500,000 more than the House version. Conference Committee meetings between the House and Senate will take place this week. If the Appropriations Bill is not passed, a Continuing Resolution Bill will keep the state government running. Mr. Waring stated we hope to have an update next week of a final budget bill.

Contracts for FY 2015-2016

Mr. Tom Waring presented information of the agency budget for FY 2015-2016 community contracts for Commission approval. Discussion followed. Commissioner Fred Lynn made the motion to approve the contracts for FY 2015-2016 as presented in the amount of \$467,341,912. Discussion followed. Mr. Waring will provide a worksheet to better explain the difference in amounts between the Spending Plan and the contracts presented today. The motion was seconded and passed. (Attachment C)

NASDDDS Update

Dr. Buscemi spoke of the NASDDDS Conference she and Mrs. Susan Beck attended last week. She shared a letter that NASDDDS was asked to write in support of the real life employment option movement. Dr. Buscemi stated that NASDDDS also took a position on behavioral support and shared the draft letter. Dr. Buscemi reported that Preadmission Screening and

Resident Review (PASRR) was a topic of discussion at the conference. It is a federal requirement to help ensure that individuals with intellectual disabilities and/or mental illness are not inappropriately placed in nursing homes for long-term care. Dr. Buscemi also had the opportunity to speak to the majority of states about how they handle the issue of sprinkler systems in home settings. She did not find one that required sprinklers for small community based homes. They consider homes a single-family dwelling. She will provide a report on this subject to the Commission and the LLR Director.

Report on Commission Work Session

Chairperson Danielson reported that many topics were discussed at the Work Session which included governance, strategic planning, quality control, and the role of the regional centers. Commissioner Lynn made the motion to submit the Commission's commitment to begin a comprehensive facilitated strategic planning process to formulate a strategic plan for the agency. The motion was seconded and passed.

State Director's Report

Dr. Buscemi reported on the following items:

ASD State Plan – the state plan for autism services is still in the development stages.

Waiver Renewals – South Carolina has received another extension on waivers from CMS. Other states are also experiencing extensions due to the Final Rule.

<u>Artwork Project</u> – Artwork is still arriving with the agency welcoming each piece. An art showing will be scheduled in the late summer or fall. Also, Art Access will contact local artists in the area to assist in art projects with the providers. If interested in working with Art Access, please contact her office.

Executive Session

On motion of Commissioner Davis, seconded and passed, the Commission entered into Executive Session to discuss contractual matters.

Enter into Public Session

The Commission entered into Public Session. It was noted that no action was taken in the Executive Session.

Next Regular Meeting Date

Chairperson Danielson announced the next Commission Meeting is scheduled for Thursday, July 16, 2015 at the DDSN Central Office
