News Release of Meeting

Chairperson Christine Sharp called the meeting to order and Commissioner Fred Lynn read a statement of announcement about the meeting that was mailed to the appropriate media, interested persons, and posted at the Central Office and on the website in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act.

Invocation

Commissioner Harvey Shiver gave the invocation.

Adoption of the Agenda

The Commission adopted the July 17, 2014 Meeting Agenda by unanimous consent. (Attachment A)

Approval of the Minutes of the June 19, 2014 Commission Meetings

The Commission approved the minutes of the June 19, 2014 Commission Meeting by unanimous consent.

<u>Public Input</u>

There was no participation in Public Input.

Report from DSN Boards

Mr. Jimmy Burton spoke on behalf of the SC Human Service Providers Association.

Commissioners' Update

Commissioners Christine Sharp and Katherine Finley spoke of events in their districts.

Recognition of Commissioner Fred Lynn

Chairperson Christine Sharp presented Commissioner Fred Lynn with a plaque recognizing him for his exemplary leadership and advocacy as Chairman of the SC Commission on Disabilities and Special Needs from January 2012 through June 2014.

FY 2015 Committee Assignments

Chairperson Christine Sharp appointed Commissioners Bill Danielson, Harvey Shiver and Eva Ravenel to the Finance Audit Committee with Commissioner Danielson serving as chairman. She appointed Commissioners July 17, 2014 DDSN Commission Meeting Minutes Page 3 of 7

Katherine Davis, Katherine Finley and Fred Lynn to the Policy Committee with Commissioner Davis serving as Chairperson.

Legislative Audit Council Report

Dr. Buscemi stated the Legislative Audit Council (LAC) Report of the agency has been released and can be viewed on the LAC website. Dr. Buscemi gave a brief overview and stated the report all in all was not a bad report. Some system changes will require state law changes. The Commission will come up with a plan of action with the assistance from agency staff. The agency will be making changes as a result of some of the recommendations.

Chairperson Christine Sharp appointed Commissioners Fred Lynn and Harvey Shiver to serve on the Ad Hoc LAC Committee. Chairperson Sharp will serve as Chairperson of the committee.

Golden Palmetto Award

Ms. Lois Park Mole presented a recommendation for the Golden Palmetto Award for 2013 which is given annually to a county in South Carolina that has best demonstrated exemplary support of citizens with disabilities and special needs during the previous year. Ms. Mole stated that Florence County and Lexington County were chosen for the award. Florence County was nominated by the Florence Disabilities and Special Needs Board and Lexington County was nominated by the Babcock Center. Both counties did an outstanding job of illustrating their council's long and supportive partnership in making people with disabilities a priority. Commissioner Harvey Shiver made the motion to accept the recommendation to award both Florence County and Lexington County the 2013 Golden Palmetto Award. The motion was seconded and passed. Chairperson Christine Sharp will present the award August 4, 2014 at the South Carolina Association of Counties' Annual Conference in Hilton Head.

Waiting List Report

Mrs. Susan Beck provided a detailed annual report on the movement of waiver waiting lists for fiscal year 2013 -2014 including a monthly report on the critical list. (Attachment B)

Dr. Buscemi stated this is the first year that DDSN is using all recurring PDD funding since the PDD Waiver Program began. She also stated that DDSN is working with DHHS on how the waiting lists will be managed.

Reduction Effort

Dr. Buscemi reported that 400 individuals on the waiting lists were awarded waiver slots in the first part of July. This consisted of 300 from the Community Supports waiting list and 100 from the ID/RD waiting list. The goal is to enroll 1400 from these waiver waiting lists during the FY15 period. DDSN and DHHS did not want to delay the movement so it was agreed to roll

out the first batch with the 300/100 proportion. The next proportion is under discussion and DDSN and DDSN are working through the bottleneck points. There is an issue of not enough personnel to complete the increased number of level of care determinations and another issue is the sponsored DHHS workers who complete the Medicaid financial eligibility process for DDSN consumers. We are not sure how this will work out but DHHS is making some changes currently in how the sponsored worker program is configured. Dr. Buscemi stated that it has been clarified that the \$13.3 million appropriated to move the waiting lists in FY15 can be used for services to state-supported, non-Medicaid eligible individuals. Mr. Keck has indicated that he intended to use DHHS funds so \$13.3 million will be spent serving Medicaid eligible individuals off the waiver waiting lists. The funding can be used only for the waiting list reduction.

Assessment Tool Usage

Dr. Buscemi stated there has been discussion of the advantages of using the SIS in determining service needs for individuals on the critical list versus using the HRST. SIS is nationally recognized and is a more comprehensive package and has a more complicated approval process whereas HRST has a much faster completion process. DDSN is discussing with DHHS on using both screening tools. Discussion followed.

Critical Needs Criteria

Dr. Buscemi stated the critical needs criteria definition is being redefined due to the waiting list reduction effort and in order to be able to serve individuals living with aging caregivers over the age of 80. Dr. Buscemi said that we want to expand the criteria a little bit but define the criteria such that needs can still be met in a timely fashion. The definition will be somewhat more relaxed than it was in the past. There will be further discussion and a decision should be made in a couple of weeks. Dr. Buscemi added that she is pleased about the process of funding the person and not the provider.

Attrition Process

Dr. Buscemi stated the Commission previously approved the waiver attrition process. This involved moving every other ID/RD waiver slot that became vacant to the Community Supports waiver. It is her recommendation that we do not continue to follow this process. Discussion followed. On motion of Katherine Finley, seconded and passed, the Commission approved that when a slot becomes vacant and if it is an ID/RD slot, it remains an IR/RD slot.

Capital Needs

Mr. Tom Waring presented information for review and approval of the Commission to provide one-time funding for deferred maintenance and infrastructure needs of the provider network to ensure the health and safety of the consumers. Discussion followed. On motion of Commissioner Harvey

Shiver, second and passed, the Commission gave approval of one-time funding in the amount of \$750,000 to offer relief for deferred maintenance and infrastructure needs to the provider network based on parameters set by DDSN.

Key Administrative Indicators

Dr. Buscemi stated that each year, DDSN develops key indicators that represent the selected areas within our directives and standards that we measure for provider compliance. The development of the key indicators for FY15 was delayed due to the policy development for MTCM and WCM. DHHS made 69 recommendations for changes to waiver related indicators. There are now 49 recoupable indicators related to waiver case management. DDSN previously had the discretion to absorb the recoupment of funds for providers, but as our system changes, the recoupment will be passed on to the provider of services affected. The new indicators were implemented July 1, 2014. Dr. Buscemi stated DDSN sought provider input regarding the changes and expressed concern to DHHS. Tony Keck has said he will assign a workgroup to address the concerns.

Consideration of Bids

Mr. Tom Waring presented information for Commission approval on the bids for the Central Office renovation project. He stated the Commission previously approved \$2.8 million for the project and now the agency is at the bid process. The Commission approved the following bids:

On motion of Commissioner Harvey Shiver, seconded and passed, the Commission confirmed the contract award for the HVAC replacement to Walker White, Inc. of Sumter, South Carolina in the contract amount of \$978,856 which included the Base Bid with Alternate Number One with permission to award to the second low bidder should the low bidder be determined non-responsible.

On motion of Commissioner Fred Lynn, seconded and passed, the Commission confirmed the contract award for the lighting replacement to MFP Electric, Inc. of West Columbia, South Carolina in the contract amount of \$138,040 which includes the Base Bid and Alternate Number One and if a problem occurs with the bid, it is to come back to DDSN for further discussion.

On motion of Commissioner Fred Lynn, seconded and passed, the Commission confirmed the contract award for the fire alarm replacement to Tyco simplex Grinnell of West Columbia, South Carolina in the contract amount of \$134,507 with permission to award to the second low bidder should the low bidder be determined non-responsible.

On motion of Commissioner Fred Lynn, seconded and passed, the Commission confirmed the contract award for the roof replacement to Southern Roofing Services, Inc. of Sumter, South Carolina in the contract amount of \$610,858 which included the Base Bid and Alternate Nos. One, Two and Three with permission to award to the second low bidder should the low bidder be determined non-responsible. (Attachment D)

State Director's Report

Dr. Buscemi reported that DDSN's eligibility determination process is now centralized effective July 1, 2014. Five employees have been hired with one in the process. At the DDSN Business Process Task Force's request from the last meeting, a flowchart will be included in the policy when it is reissued.

Dr. Buscemi asked Mr. Tom Waring to explain the 95/98 rule. The rule will become irrelevant if the provider network is paid retrospectively for all services. With DDSN's current per member per month prospective payment system the 98/95 rule is needed to assure that funds are used for service delivery. The Fiscal and the Quality Assurance divisions are evaluating the rule. Mr. Waring stated a proposal will be presented to the Commission.

Dr. Buscemi spoke of the CMS Bulletin that was recently released requiring states to include ABA services for children on Autism Spectrum through Medicaid State Plan Services including EPSDT. She added that we are not sure what this means for the PDD Waiver. This change is a good thing, as more children could receive services however, there is presently a provider shortage, and this will become worse with the expansion.

Dr. Buscemi gave an update on the CLOUD Pilot Program. The program has demonstrated success. It is not only better for the individuals but also costs less to serve them. New providers are interested in participating in this program thus a question and answer informational meeting is being scheduled for early August.

Dr. Buscemi stated the Public Consulting Group report is complete and they will conduct a formal presentation of the report at the August Commission meeting.

Dr. Buscemi announced a Policy Committee meeting has been scheduled for Wednesday, July 23, 2014 at 1:30 p.m. in Conference Room 180. Also, the October 16, 2013 Commission meeting has been rescheduled for October 23, 2014.

Next Regular Meeting Date

Chairperson Christine Sharp announced the next regular Commission Meeting is scheduled for Thursday, August 21, 2014 with the starting time to be determined.


