RE: Market Rate Case Management Issue – October 2019 Billing Report

For the past 15 months, DDSN has been issuing Billing Efficiency Reports to providers comparing market rate revenue to the previously issued monthly prospective payment for Waiver individuals. As we have moved forward into fee for service (FFS) billing for all case management types, DDSN has adjusted revenue reporting to providers to issue more meaningful metrics to the provider agencies. The new metrics provide data on both waiver and non-waiver individuals.

Attached you will find the "Case Management Review by Provider" report for October 2019. The reports include the

average monthly revenue per waiver individuals, the average revenue per non-waiver individuals (MTCM/SFCM) and a total average revenue per individual. This data will allow a provider to evaluate, over time, the average monthly revenue being generated per individuals so that the provider can determine the appropriate number of case managers/supervisors needed based on the total

number of cases served by the agency. The statewide average revenue per individual is outlined in the chart for October.

Additionally, of the individuals enrolled in the waiver on October 31st, 320 of them did not have a reportable note submitted during the Month of August despite the WCM requirement to do so. This represents 2.7% of the waiver individuals in the system. This is an improvement over September (4.7%) but still represents a lost opportunity to serve and connect with individuals as well as potential revenue being dropped.

New Invoices

As part of the new invoice for WCM and MTCM there are units paid and potentially recoupable from providers due to Medicaid eligibility concerns. There are units not paid this month but can possibly be corrected and resubmitted next month. Please see the memo that went out on September 9th regarding <u>Invoice Report Analysis Guidance</u> for instructions on how to take action on the invoice issues. A review of the October 2019 invoices for Medicaid ineligible and not paid are reflected in the charts below:
